BEYOND THE DRAWING BOARD: USING HYPERMEDIA IN LIBRARIES

The potential for hypermedia in libraries has been evident in the literature and at conferences for some time. Many librarians, however, still struggle with some basic issues concerning hypermedia: namely figuring out how to start a hypermedia program, identifying uses, advantages, and disadvantages, and addressing cost and equipment needs.

This program will address these issues with a keynote address and four breakout sessions.

Keynote Address:

Dr. Ching-chih Chen, Professor and Associate Dean (Simmons College, Graduate School of Library and Information Science), will focus on how to get started in hypermedia, addressing the issues outlined above. Dr. Chen will also discuss Project Emperor, a hypermedia archaeological program.

Break out Sessions

Mary Piette, Reference Librarian (Utah State University), will demonstrate hypermedia applications for university and college libraries using Apple's HyperCard.

James Jeffries, Librarian (Shady Side Academy, Pittsburgh), will demonstrate how hypermedia can be used in secondary schools.

Ed Stockey, Automation Officer (Indiana University, Bloomington), will demonstrate how to use IBM's Linkway graphic interface to develop a graphic user interface for NOTIS.

Sylvia Carson, Library Systems and Standards Specialist (Penn State University, University Park), will demonstrate possible library applications using the NeXT computer.
